"We are so grateful for the support of McLeod County United Way. Last year we were able to serve 354 clients, 258 of which were brand new. We provided Legal Advocacy 763 times, including accompaniment to court. 914 crisis and support calls were answered by staff. We referred clients to other local support agencies 623 times. School and community presentations on domestic violence and safe relationships were given. McLeod Alliance is happy to be a part of our community and always here to help those in need. United Community Action Partnership - Emergency Services 2020 Grant Awardee

"The funds from United Way of McLeod County will be used for direct assistance needs of people who are in crisis. Funds will be used to fill gaps in crisis service for things that are not able to be solved with existing programs in McLeod County. For example, our Energy Assistance Program (EAP) can assist people with heat and electric costs but is unable to assist with water/sewer/garbage costs. Another example would be in assisting people who are homeless get into housing by providing things like inflatable beds, cleaning supplies, basic cookware, silverware, shower curtains, towels, etc. We are grateful for the funding from UWMC which helps people in the greatest need." - Angela Larson, Family Services Director

"Funding from United Way of McLeod County will help cover the cost of meals for low-income seniors who cannot afford to contribute, but rely on our meals to help meet their nutritional requirements. This year we hope to provide a minimum of 43,500 meals to 467 unduplicated seniors living in McLeod County.
